REMARKS OF HIS EXCELLENCY ARCHBISHOP CHRISTOPHE PIERRE FOR THE INSTALLATION OF THE MOST REVEREND MARIO DORSONVILLE-RODRÍGUEZ AS FIFTH BISHOP OF HOUMA-THIBODAUX THE CATHEDRAL OF ST. FRANCIS DE SALES HOUMA, LOUISIANA MARCH 29, 2023

To begin, I would like to welcome Cardinal Gregory and Cardinal Wuerl, and all my brother bishops who are here in such great number, including Archbishop Broglio, the President of the Bishops' Conference. Archbishop Fabre, thank you for your service to this Diocese from 2013 to 2022, and thank you for the support that you have given during this time of transition, along with Archbishop Aymond, the Metropolitan Archbishop of this Province. Welcome also to the other former Bishops of this Diocese: Bishop Sam Jacobs and Bishop Michael Jarrell.

Greetings to the many priests who are here, with a special "thank you" to Fr. P.J. Madden, who has served, with great energy and a joyful spirit, as Diocesan Administrator since March of last year.

Dear Deacons, Consecrated Religious, and Members of the Faithful; Dear Friends: it is a joy for me to represent the Holy Father as we celebrate the installation of Bishop Mario Dorsonville as the 5<sup>th</sup> Bishop of Houma-Thibodaux. From Colombia, where he was born; to Washington, D.C., where he has served since the 1990s and where I have gotten to know him; Bishop Dorsonville has now found a new *home* in *Houma*.

Bishop Dorsonville, I know that you will make a home here, because you will find in this Diocese many opportunities to continue your ministry as shepherd.
